Born in 1961, Chia Chi Jason WANG lives and works in Taiwan as a curator and art critic. He was the curator of the Taiwan Biennial 2008, the Taiwan Pavilion at the 51st International Art Exhibition of the Biennale of Venice 2005, and the 9th International Architecture Exhibition of the Biennale of Venice 2004. He also worked as co-curator of the 2002 Taipei Biennial *Great Theatre of the World*. His other recent positions included Curator of Museum of Contemporary Art, Taipei (2001), and Executive Director of the Dimension Endowment of Art (2001-1002).

He also served on the Academic Advisory Board of Asia Art Archive from 2004 to 2009.

Over the years, he has undertaken major English-Chinese translation projects, focusing on the fields of Art Criticism, Art Theory and Art History. He also taught as a full-time lecturer at the Department of Arts and Design, National Hsinchu University of Education from 2/2006 to 7/2012.

He graduated from the English Department of Fu-Jen Catholic University (B.A., 1984), the Institute of Fine Arts of Chinese Culture University (M.A. in Art History, 1986), and the Group in Asian Studies of the University of California at Berkeley (M.A., 1991).
